Whereas: *School social workers* participate as specialized contributors at the community, district, state and national level to promote efforts at improving student academic achievement and personal well being;

Whereas: *School social workers* participate in the development of global citizens by promoting skills for a life time and life-long learning;

Whereas: *School social workers* provide interventions to address challenges such as: mental health, behavior difficulties, disabilities, crisis response, poverty, bullying, abuse, grief, addiction, etc. to enable students to achieve academic goals;
